INSTRUCTIONS

The Declaration of Identity Form MUST be completed by one of the following individuals who will in this document, be called the Declarant :

1. Mother
2. Father if his name is on your Birth Certificate
3. Older brother
4. Older Sister

If the above mentioned individuals are deceased, then you should speak with a Consular Officer at the Consulate General of Jamaica, Miami for guidance on completing this form.

The Declaration of Identity Form MUST be duly completed and signed by the Declarant and notarized by a Notary Public, if the Declarant will not be appearing in person at the Consulate. The signature of the Declarant should match the signature on their valid identification card.

The following documents MUST be submitted along with the Declaration of Identity Form:

1. Original copy of the Declarant's Birth Certificate, if the Declarant is a brother or sister
2. Original copy of the Declarant's Marriage Certificate, if applicable
3. Original or notarized copies of the front and reverse side of the Declarant's valid Federal or State issued identification card (i.e. passport, driver's license, State ID or Permanent Residency Card).
